






The building entrance is accessed by a level pathway that was built up along the sloped site. Barrier-free parking is readily available, and the building is easily accessed by all. The existing entrance lobby is a large space that is to serve the future library as well as a upper floor current tenant. This lobby has two elevators, egress stairs and public restrooms. The intent is to preserve that arrangement except for one elevator that will be captured to exclusively serve the library.

The library will be spread out across the two assigned floors. The main floor level will house the circulation desk, popular materials, meeting spaces, young adults, children's services and staff offices. Patrons will be able to enter the library as well as the main meeting room directly from the lobby.

In addition to the use of one existing elevator dedicated for library patrons, a new open stair is to be cut into the structure as a direct link to the lower level. This lower level is envisioned as a quieter environment that will hold the main adult stacks and reference collection. This level leads to a unique outdoor patio that is being added to the building. The patio provides a wonderful green space for reading and socializing yet also serves as a required means of egress for the library.

At the start of the design process the architects met with staff, the director, and trustees to gather information and discuss the potential solution for such needs. Through this interaction and an understanding of the building's configuration, it was decided that a two-story concept was required to meet the library's needs. Several configurations were explored and the following design was agreed upon by all.

New energy efficient lighting and mechanical systems will be employed throughout the renovated spaces. Recycled and renewable materials will be incorporated throughout the space for function and as a learning tool.





A1 New Signage Prospect Ave Off Route 280




